

### Homonym Recap:



Two or more words having the same spelling or pronunciation but have different meanings and origins.

Homonyms may be words with identical pronunciations but different spellings and meanings, such as *to, too*, and *two*.

Or they may be words with *identical pronunciations* and *identical spellings* but different meanings, such as *quail* (the bird) and *quail* (to cringe) Sign/Sign, Tie/tie, Tip/tip/tip.



# Hebrew word vayehi


is often used to connect

Children of Israel.


The phrase "and it came to pass," appears  $\sim 727 \sim \text{times in the KJV}$ .



In Scripture,
particularly in the Old Testament
we see the phrase;
"And it came to pass..."

- As a passage of time that replaces the words: 'when,' 'whenever,' 'after,' 'at that time' or 'in those days.'
- Denoting times and periods, phases and seasons that were important for the narrative.
- Another way of saying 'It happened ...'
- While the events happened in the past they are now for our benefit and empowerment.




# Invitation and Benediction:
