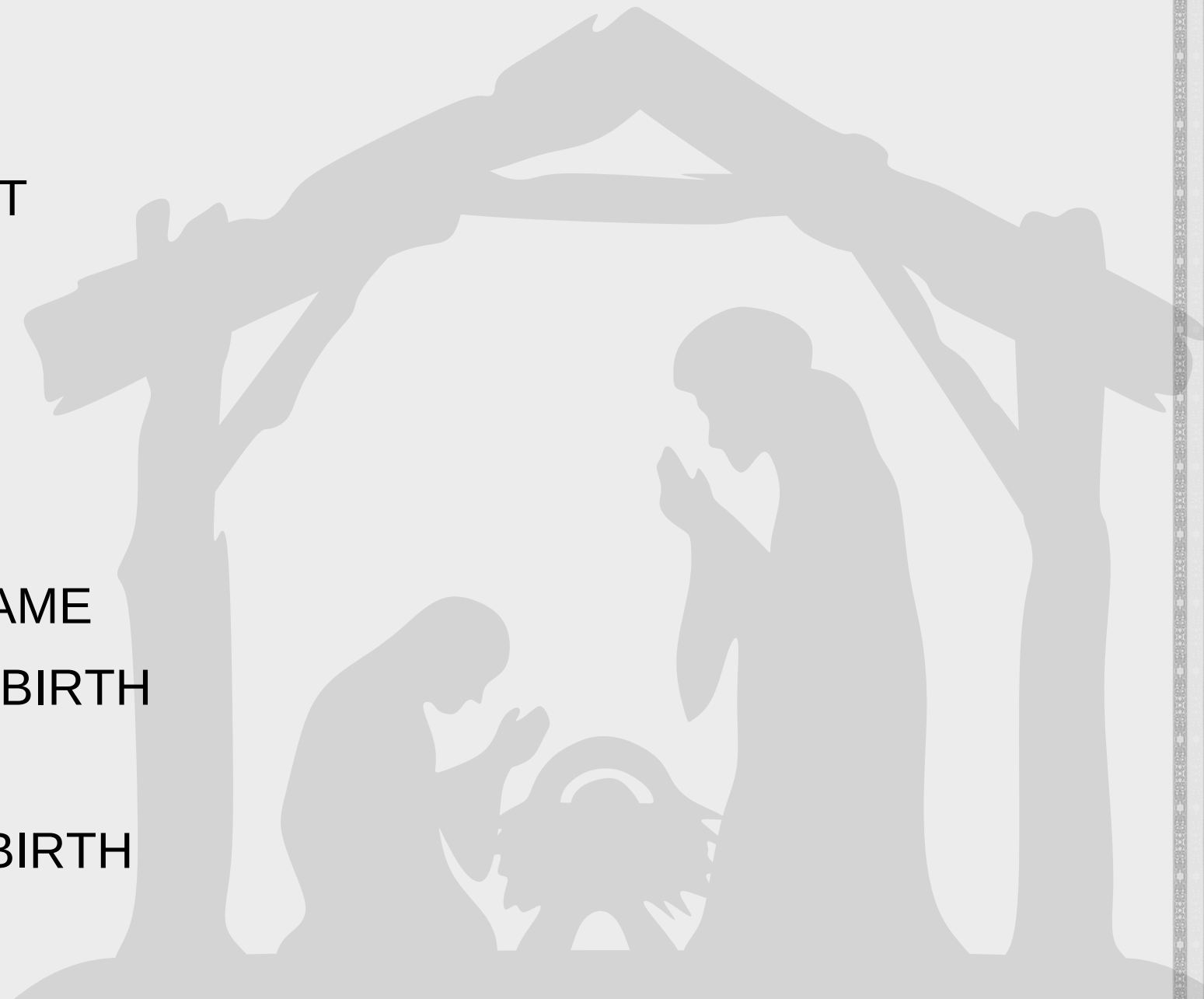

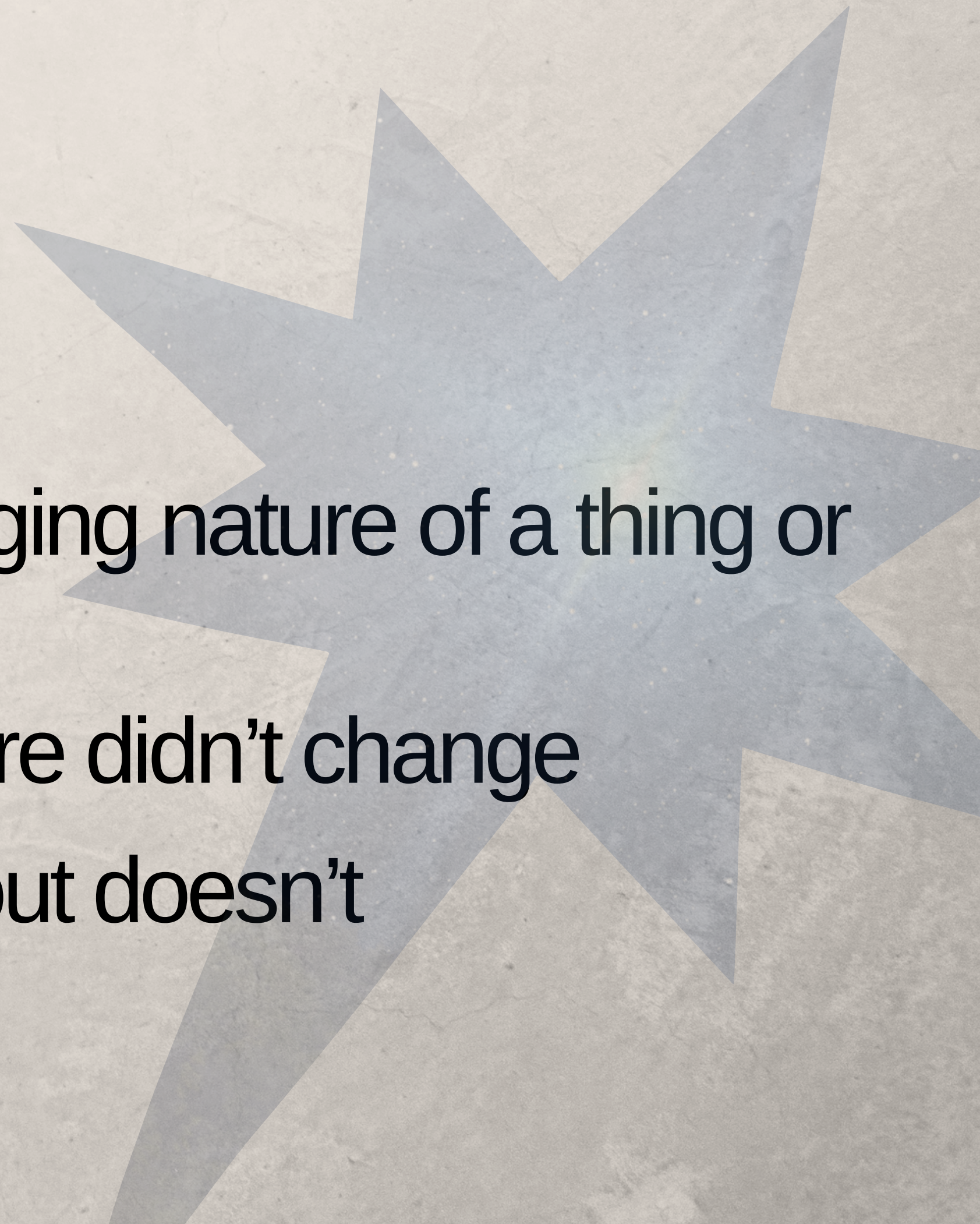
Birth Certificate Complexities

## **John 1:1**

## **John 8:58**

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.



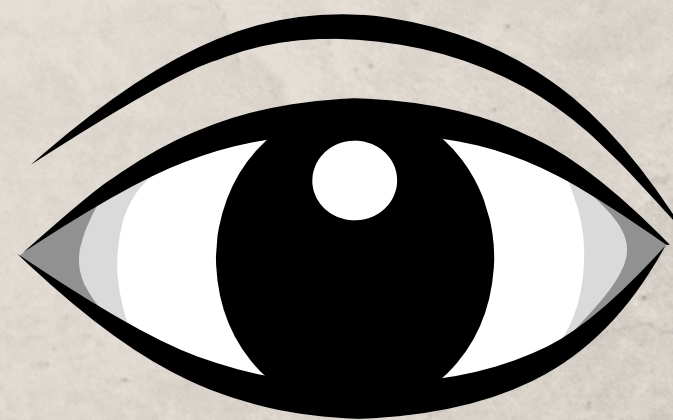

# Jesus Calls Philip and Nathanael in John 1

43 The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. **He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me."** 44 Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. 45 **Philip found Nathanael** and said to him, "We have found him of whom Moses in the Law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."

46 Nathanael said to him, "**Can anything good come out of Nazareth?**" Philip said to him, "Come and see." 47 **Jesus saw Nathanael** coming toward him and said of him, "**Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no deceit!**" 48 Nathanael said to him, "How do you know me?" Jesus answered him, "Before Philip called you, **when you were under the fig tree, I saw you.**"

49 Nathanael answered him, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" 50 Jesus answered him, "Because I said to **you, I saw you under the fig tree**, do you believe? You will see greater things than these." 51 And he said to him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you will see heaven opened, and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man."



# Nathanael is Projecting

John 1:46

Nathanael said to him, “Can anything good come out of Nazareth?” Philip said to him, “Come and see.”

Negative projecting is a psychological defense mechanism where an individual unconsciously attributes their negative traits or feelings onto someone else. It is a way for the individual to avoid dealing with their own issues and instead project them onto others.

Nathanael might be struggling because he doesn't receive enough recognition or admiration from his family or peers, which could be connected to his background.



# Why Nathanael is projecting

One of the 12 Disciples-ish

Bartholomew may be same person as Nathanael

If it's Bartholomew, that's the name used more often going forward in the other Gospels

Nathanael is only mentioned once in John 1. Not enough airtime to pay attention to the name

Jesus found Philip, but Philip found Nathanael so Nathanael was not by selection but referral

Nathanael's association with a fig tree could paint Nathanael in a negative light  
(Jesus cursed a fig tree)

Issues persist to this day on who he really is and if he belongs on the team of known disciples

Jesus knew what buttons to push to connect with Nathanael to change his heart. The button was Empathy. Jesus knows what it feels like to be overlooked, abused, talked about, forgotten, underrated, mistreated and have embarrassing things go on in the family. I see you under the FIG Tree! I cursed the tree not you. I am the tree of life.



## **The entire book of John highlights the drama, confusion, and cries around the Identity of Jesus**

John had to clarify that he was not the Messiah **John 1:19**

The Jews wanted Jesus to prove he had the authority to do things like cleansing the temple of unrighteousness. **John 2:13**

John had to clarify yet again about Jesus **John 3:28**

The Samaritan woman who Jesus counseled at the well, convinced other Samaritans Jesus was the Messiah. **John 4:42**, “They said to the woman, “We no longer believe just because of what you said; now we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this man really is the Savior of the world.”

Jesus testifies of himself and it is greater than anyone else. **John 5:36-42** They said to the woman, “We no longer believe just because of what you said; now we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this man really is the Savior of the world.”

“I have testimony weightier than that of John. For the works that the Father has given me to finish—the very works that I am doing—testify that the Father has sent me. And the Father who sent me has himself testified concerning me. You have never heard his voice nor seen his form, nor does his word dwell in you, for you do not believe the one he sent.

# Overcoming Projecting

- **Practice metacognition:** Being mindful of your own thoughts, feelings, and emotions can help you identify when you are projecting negativity onto others. When you notice yourself doing this, take a step back and try to understand why you are feeling this way. Make sure your thoughts align with God's Word.
- **Take responsibility:** Recognize that negative projecting is your own issue, and take responsibility for it. Avoid blaming others for your negative emotions, and work on managing them yourself.
- **Seek help:** If you find that negative projecting is difficult to overcome on your own, consider seeking Godly wisdom from family or friends who will speak the truth in love. They can help you identify the root of your negative emotions and provide strategies to overcome them.
