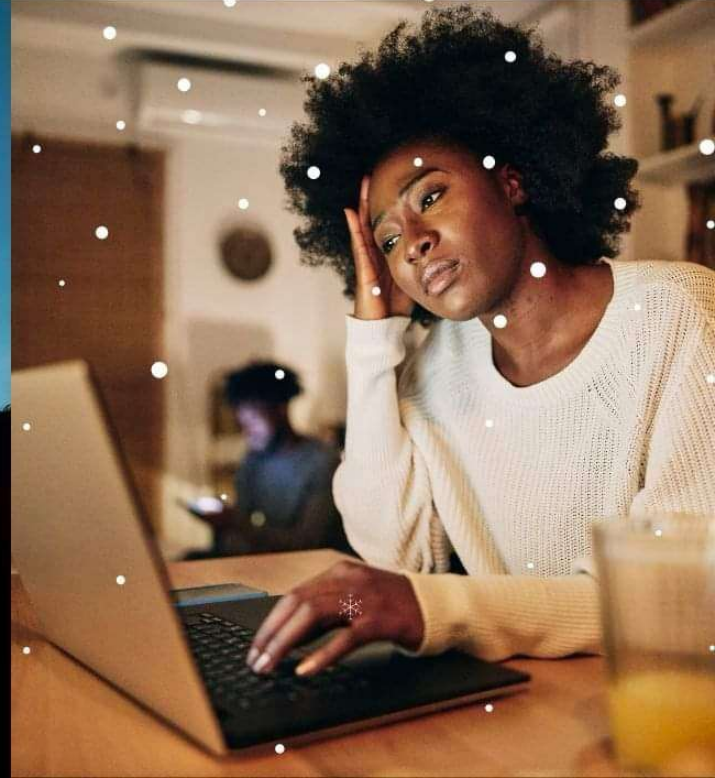

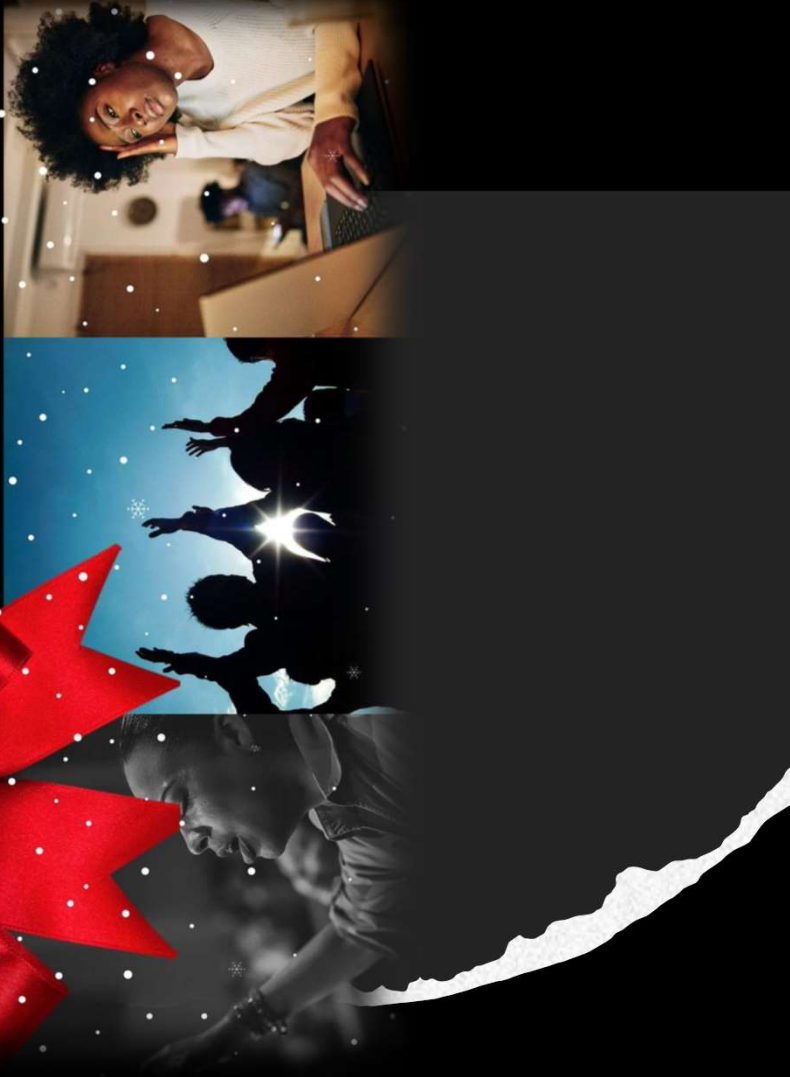

RE ~

The word "re" appears about 40 times per million words in modern written English. It is a borrowing from Latin and has been in use in English since at least the early 18th century.



In the Bible, the verb "re" appears over 400 times. In shorthand, "re" is used to draw attention to a specific subject. The English vocabulary is estimated to be around 1 million words.

That is an estimated 40 Million times the "Re" is used in the English language.



More about “RE”

The term/word “re” has several meanings:


In business letters,
it means “about” or “on the subject of.”

In email subject lines,
it indicates a reply to another email.

As a prefix, “RE” means “again.”

Originated in the late Middle English
(as a verb): from Old French prefixer,
from Latin praefixus ‘fixed in front’,
from the verb praefigere,
from prae ‘before’ + figere ‘to fix’.

The noun is from modern Latin praefixum,
neuter (used as a noun) of praefixus,
and dates from the mid 17th century.



Joy – Christian Faith Guide

The exact number of times joy is mentioned in the Bible varies. Some Bible scholars suggest that it appears 430 times, others offer 224 instances.

One of the things that contribute to the difference in the count is words like joyful and rejoice.

Psalm 4:7 - Fellowship with God brings Great Joy.

Psalm 16:11 - In God's Presence can we find True Joy.

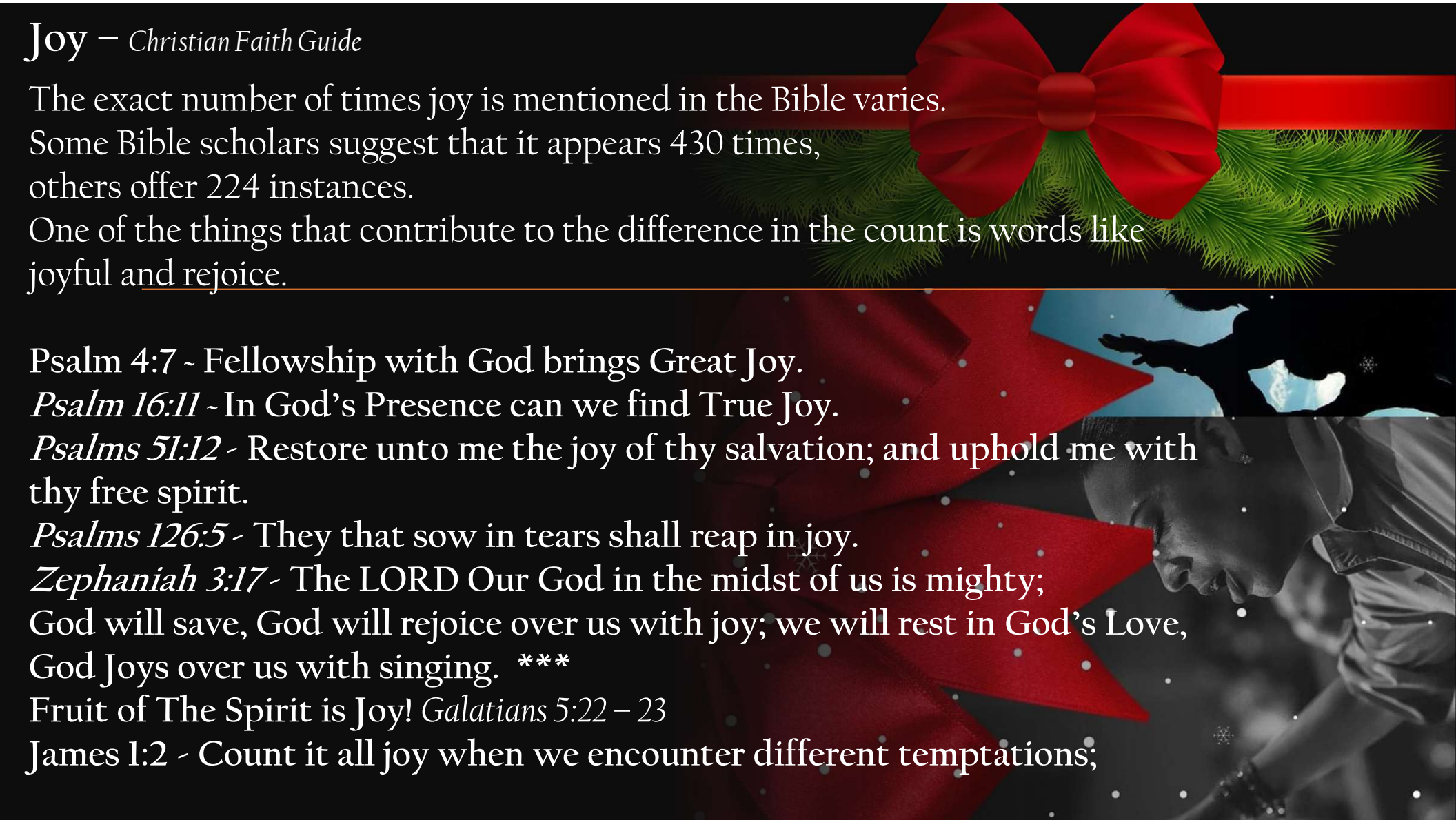
Psalms 51:12 - Restore unto me the joy of thy salvation; and uphold me with thy free spirit.

Psalms 126:5 - They that sow in tears shall reap in joy.

Zephaniah 3:17 - The LORD Our God in the midst of us is mighty; God will save, God will rejoice over us with joy; we will rest in God's Love, God Joys over us with singing. ***

Singing is mentioned over 400 times in the Bible. Singing is used as a means of expressing joy, thanksgiving, and lamentation.

The Psalms, in particular, contain numerous references to singing and are also written to be sung.

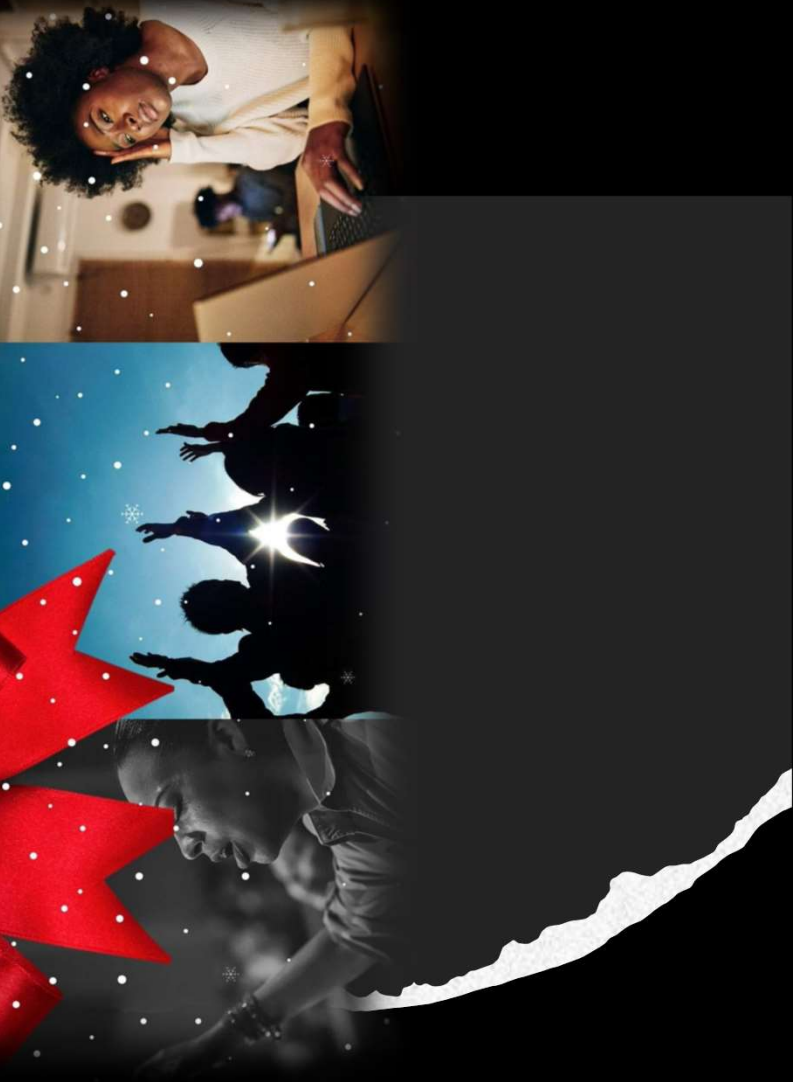

Re – Write, Re – eXperience, Re – Yield, Re – Zest

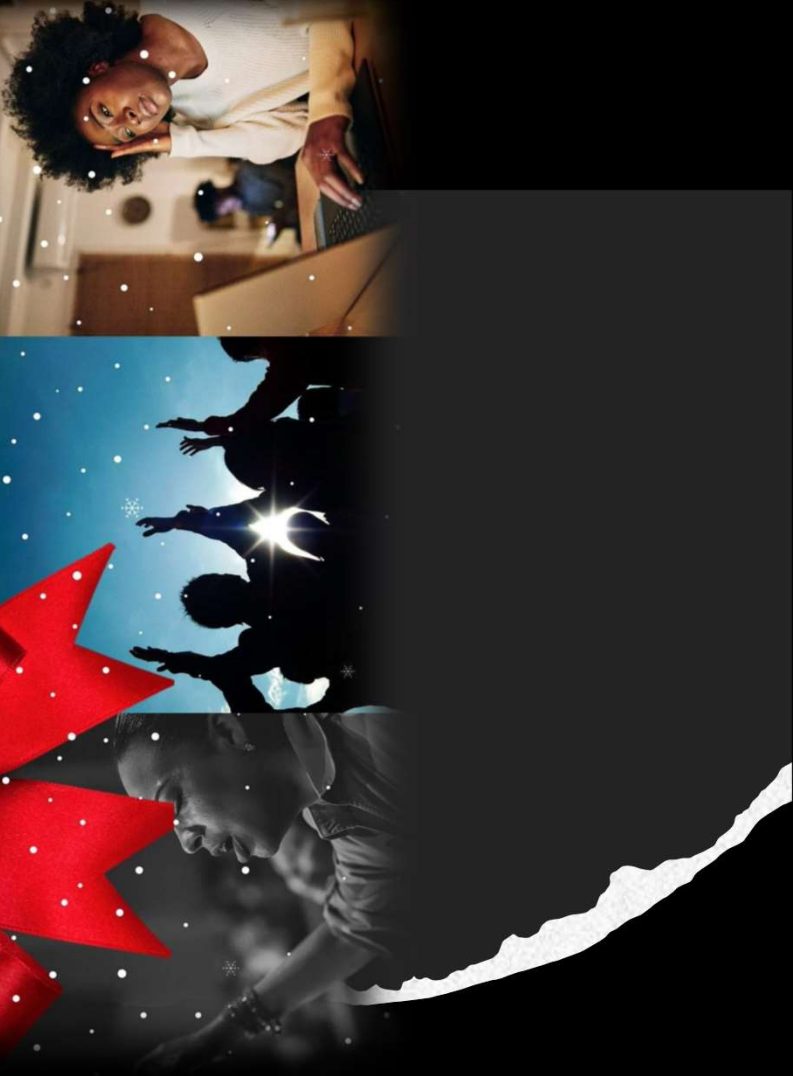
