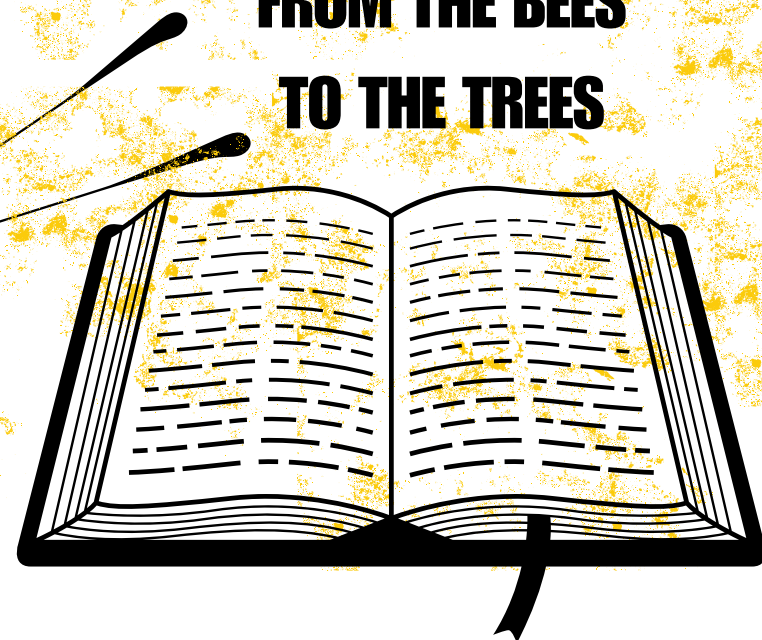

1 Corinthians 3:6-9

6 I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow.

7 So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but **only God, who makes things grow.**

8 The one who plants and the one who waters have one purpose, and they will each be rewarded according to their own labor.

9 For we are co-workers in God's service; you are God's field, God's building.

Luke 14 (NIV)

1 One Sabbath, when Jesus went to eat in the house of a prominent Pharisee, he was being carefully watched.

Skipping to verse 13

13 But when you give a **banquet**, invite **the poor**, the crippled, the lame, the blind,
14 and you will be blessed. Although **they cannot repay you**, you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

15 A man comments that: **those who will eat in the kingdom of God are blessed.**

Luke 14 (NIV)

Verses 16–17: Jesus replies with a parable: A man **prepared** a great banquet and **invited many guests**. When the banquet was ready, he sent his servant to tell those who had been invited that everything was now prepared.

The Pharisees and experts in the law had strong beliefs about something called the Messianic feast—a great banquet that would happen at the arrival of God’s kingdom. They often debated who should be invited and who was worthy to attend.

Their ideas came from the Old Testament scriptures, which described a future celebration where God would bless His people. As Jesus told His parable about a banquet here in **Luke 14:15-24**.

So when hearing this parable the Pharisees likely had these scriptures in mind. They believed that only the righteous—especially those who followed the law carefully—would be part of this great feast. But Jesus challenged their ideas, suggesting that God’s invitation was open to unexpected people, even those the Pharisees might exclude.

"On this mountain the Lord Almighty will prepare a feast of rich food for all peoples, a banquet of aged wine—the best of meats and the finest of wines. On this mountain, he will destroy the shroud that enfolds all peoples...He will swallow up death forever."

Isaiah 25:6–8

A Table in the Presence of Enemies

"You prepare a table before me in the presence of my
enemies."

Luke 14:18-20 (NIV)

18-20: However, those invited began to make excuses.

One had bought a field and needed to go see it,
another had bought oxen and needed to try them out,
and another had just gotten married and couldn't attend.

EXCUSES

Don't let the field make a fool out of you.

Your oxen (meal) can wait, don't miss God.

Don't let your spouse make you miss God's house.

Luke 14 (NIV)

Verses 21-23: The servant returned and reported these excuses. The master of the house became angry and told the servant to go into the streets and alleys of the town and invite the poor, crippled, blind, and lame.

When there was still room, the servant was told to go out into the roads and country lanes to compel more people to come so that my house will be full.

Verse 24: Jesus concludes, "I tell you, not one of those who were invited will get a taste of my banquet."



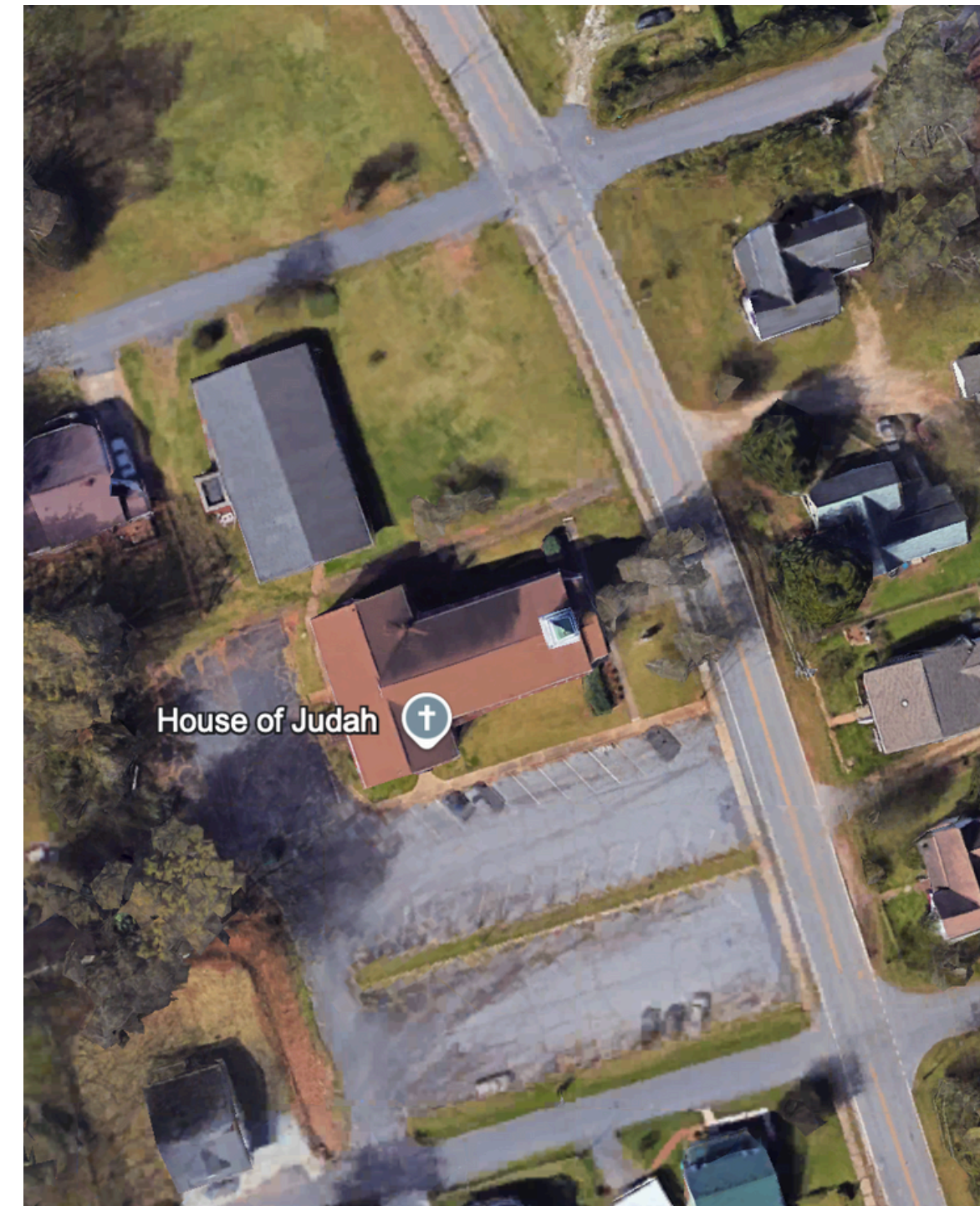

- Grief care packages with prayer



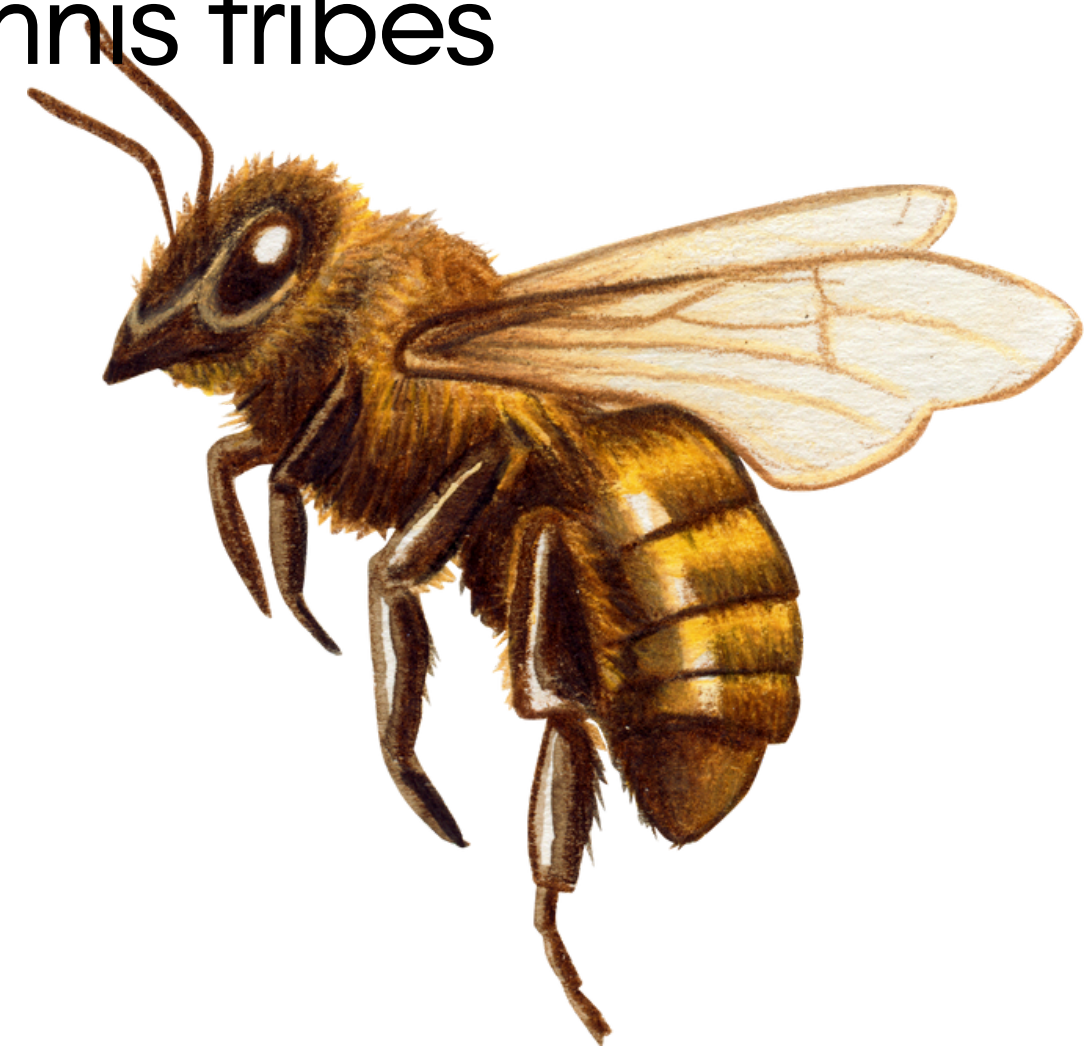
I just want to serve
