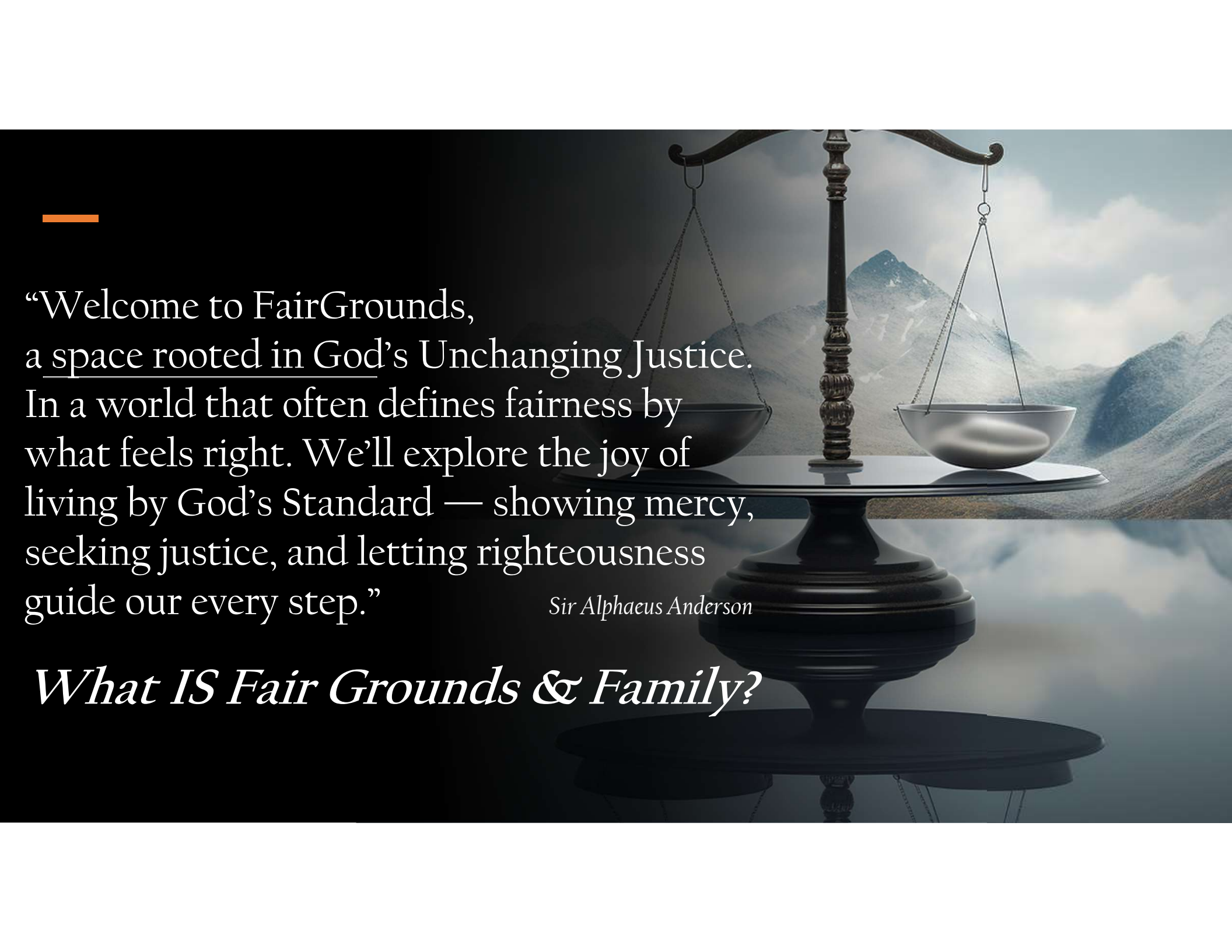

How is “This” fairgrounds?

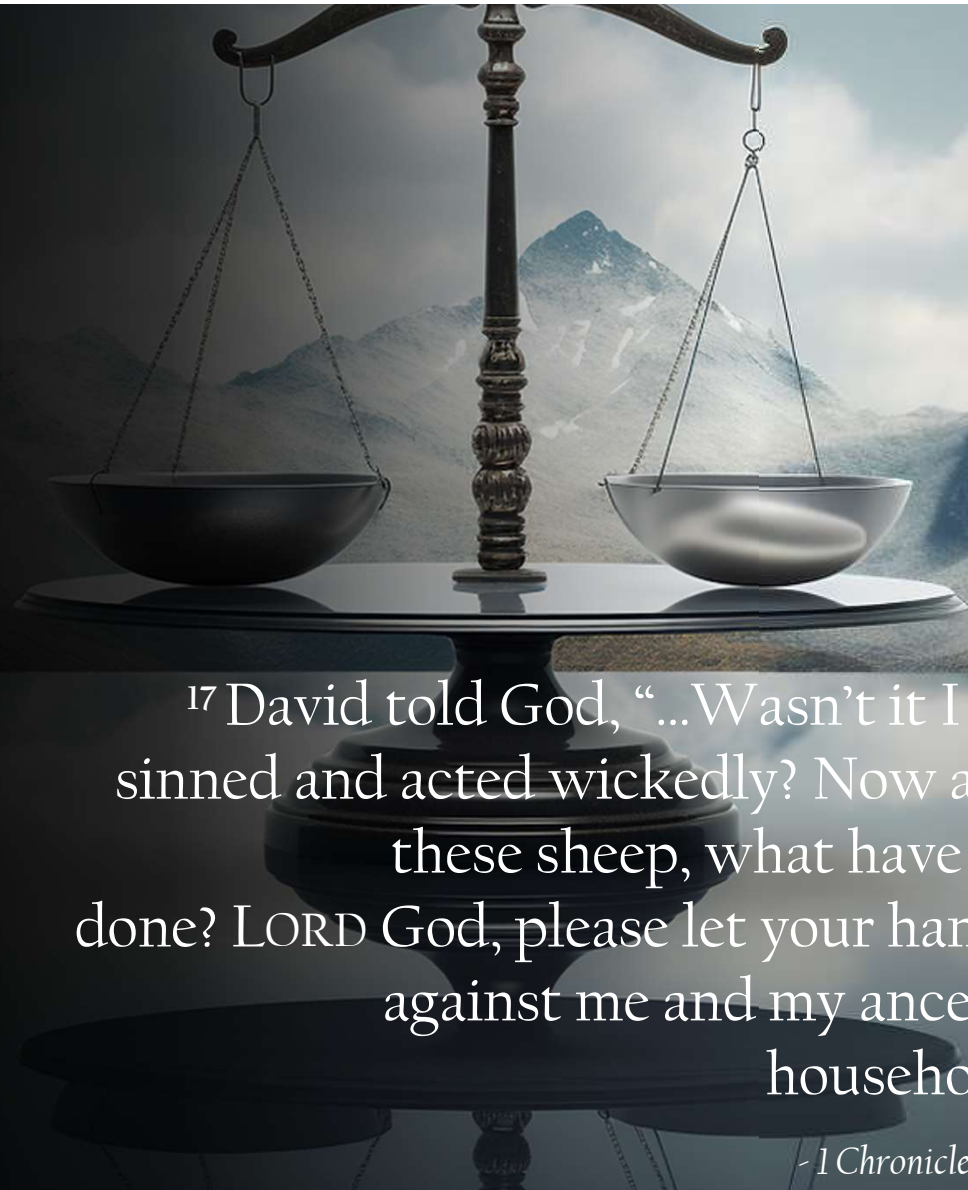


35 and Counting

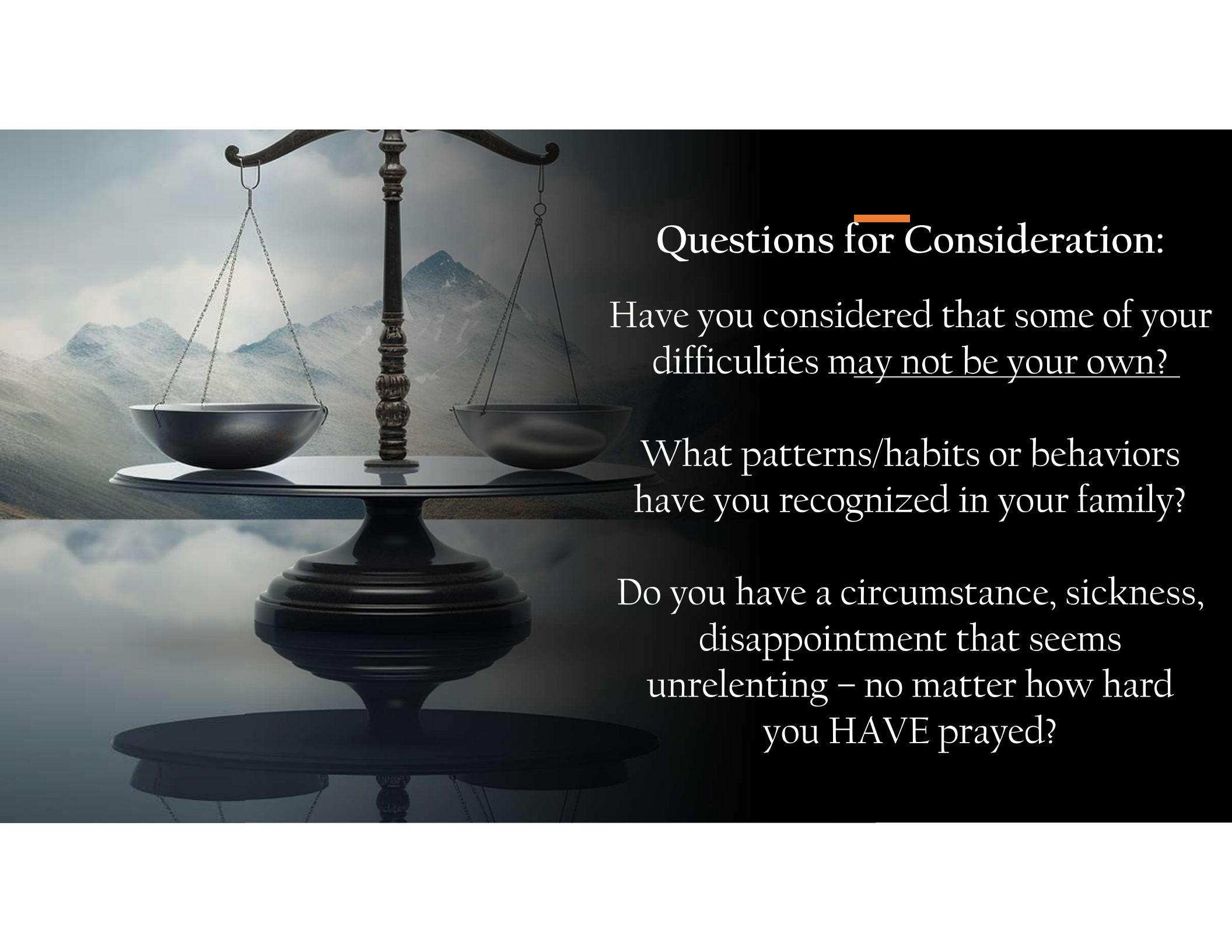
But they cried out all the more, saying, “Let Him be crucified!”

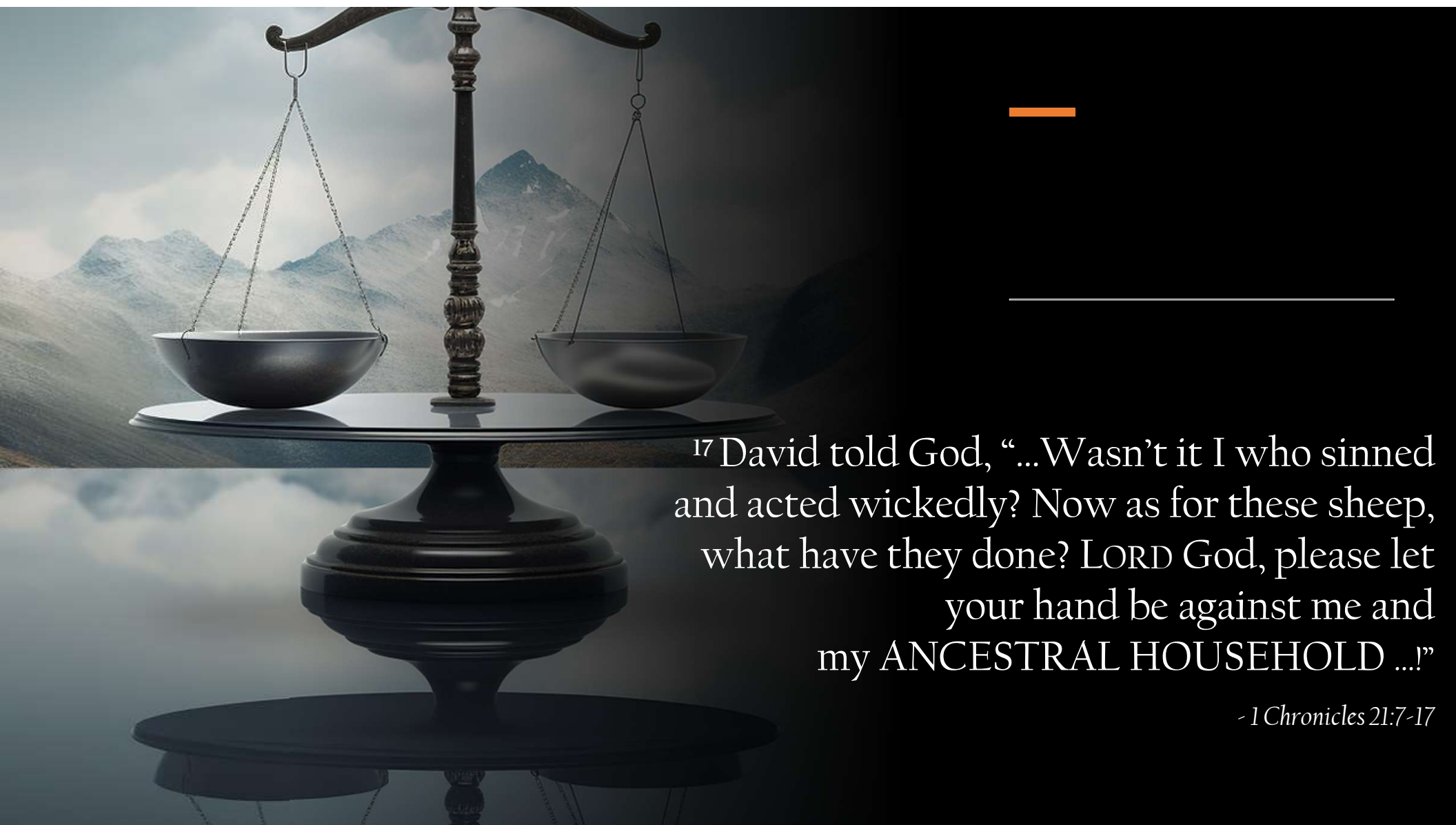


Questions for Consideration:

“I, even I, am he who blots out your transgressions, for my own sake, and remembers your sins no more.”

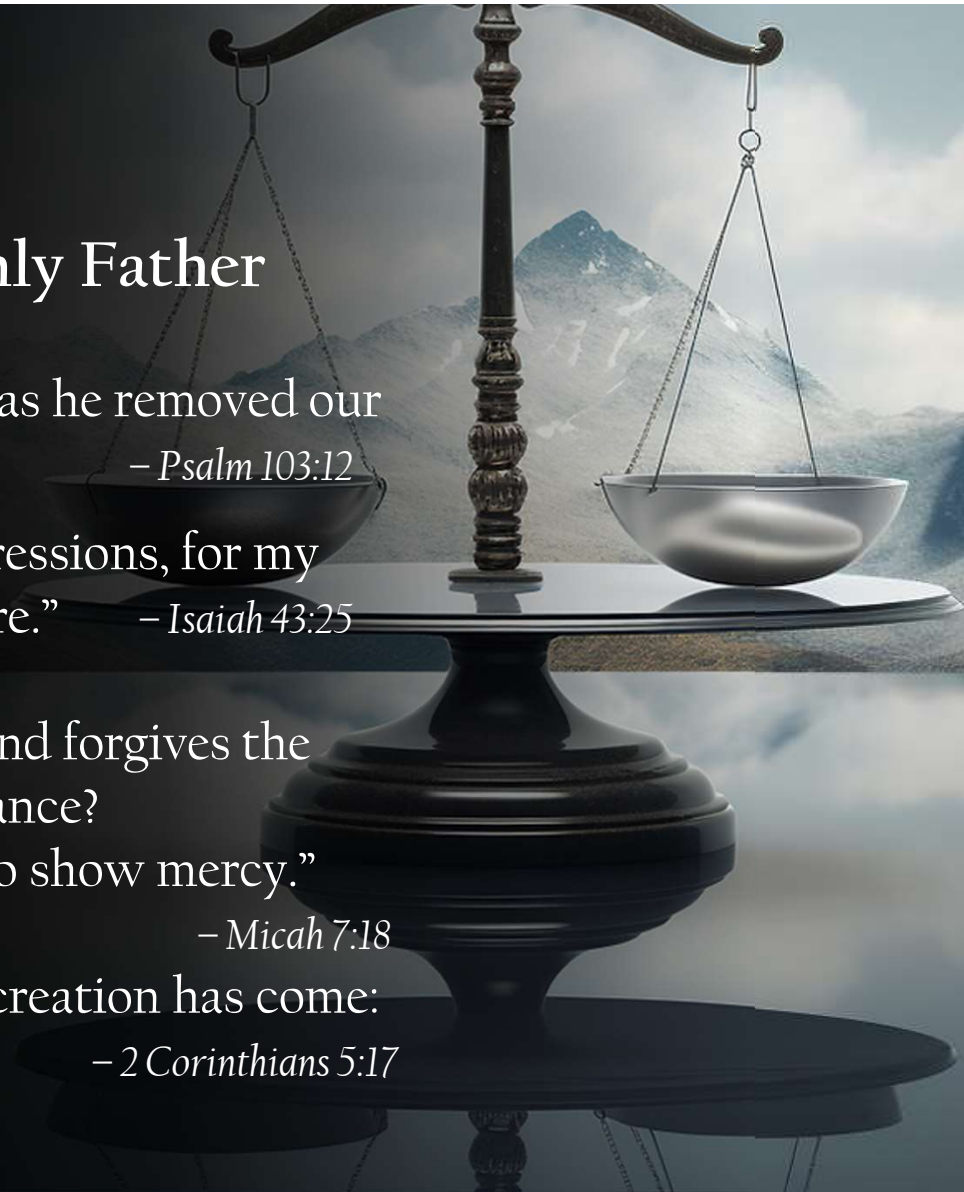

In the Bible, Adam is referred to as the first man, symbolizing humanity's beginning, while Christ is called The Second man, representing Divine Redemption.

- Adam is created from the dust of the ground and is described as a living being, embodying the natural humanity of all humans.
- Christ, The Last Adam, is referred to as Our Life Giving Spirit, signifying His Divine Nature and His Resurrection.
- These distinctions are The Key to our transformation from a physical, earthly existence to our Spiritual, Heavenly Identity through Christ.
